- 2. MPD 1st District Crime and Community Awareness, Captain Jonathan Dorrough,

- Elevated robberies still on a rise
- No consistent problems
 - There are no longer snatch related robberies, intoxicated related crime on the rise during the day
 - 1. Snatch: elderly female paying at meter
 - 2. Assault stopped by officers and arrest made before entering metro
 - 3. Elderly and juvenile crime on a rise
 - Manpower deployed to resolve issue
 - Property crime down 35%
- Question: JoAnn: Is crime happening only on 7th and H Street NW
 - o Follow up:
 - 1. Crime is more dispersed

- 2. Very minimal crime south of Pennsylvania Ave
- 3. Reports of drug activity in front of SEI. (Commission Wilsey has photos; Officer Dorrough said he will deploy MPD to resolve)
- 3. MPD 2nd District Crime and Community Awareness, Lieutenant Latoyia Heath,

- Assault with dangerous weapons and clubs fights on the rise
 - 5 robberies for the month
 - 1 closed with an arrest
 - 4 have video surveillance and citizens have been notified
 - Theft from CVS and Walgreens on the rise
 - Mountain bike units deployed
 - Theft from auto up by 2 robberies
 - Fliers to inform visitors and residents on cars have been placed.
 - No vehicle thefts
 - No burglaries
- Commissioner Shankle: Revisiting last month campaign led by Sgt. Shedd to address idling buses
 - Response: units are deployed with traffic officers to assist moving people and cars in traffic

 - Including
 - 1. Liquor License Live Entertainment
 - 2. Hours of Operation 8am 12am
 - 3. Concerns limiting access to terrace
 - 4. If doors on terrace will be propped open
 - 5. Will there be speakers in the summer garden

- Commissioner Wilsey: Protest license in lieu that residents do not come to an agreement with establishment
- Motion: To protest if no agreement met (Commission Wilsey)
- Motion 2: Amend if agreed upon and Commission will support license (Commission Shankle)

 - Motion: Modification of consequence to add windows to back of building all in favor
